#### INTRODUCTION

### A Prediction and a Promise

- 1. Prediction: Conflict between Satan's seed and woman's seed.
- 2. Promise: Victory for the woman's seed.

## The Terms Defined

- 1. **Enmity** "ill-will, hatred, strife" (Implied: WARFARE)
- 2. **Seed** "ancestors, posterity or offspring"
- 3. **Bruise** "to crush, to trample down" (Implies: Laying in Wait)
- 4. Head "the superior position, signifying the object of power, control and authority"
   See Matt. 28:18; Col 1:18; Eph 1:22.
- 5. **Heel** "the lesser position, that which is instrumental in trying to crush the seed."

# The Nature of Redemption

- 1. **Promised -** A part of God's eternal plan and purpose.
- Costly Won in a hard, bitter, bloody struggle.
- 3. **Historical** Told in the framework of a redemptive revelation.

## AIM:

- 1. To become aware of the viciousness of Satan and his intent to harm that seed.
- 2. To see that there is a greater power than Satan.
- 3. To understand that God's purposes will be providentially carried out. Nothing will stop God's progress toward His goal.

## THE HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE CONFLICT

- A. Cain and Abel (Gen. 4:1-8, 25).
  - 1. Satan, through Cain, destroyed the "righteous Abel", seeming to be victorious.
  - 2. BUT GOD! "Appointed another seed instead of Abel", Seth (vs. 25). NOTE: The "seed of woman" survives and continues.
- B. Daughters of Men and Sons of God (Gen. 6:7, 8, 12).
  - 1. Righteous marries unrighteous, wickedness ensues.
  - 2. A Universal Flood "... and all flesh died ... every man ..." (7:21-22).
  - 3. BUT GOD! "Noah found favor" (v. 8).

    NOTE: The Seed-family is preserved and continues.
- C. Barren Womb and Abundant Promise (Gen. 17:15-19).
  - 1. God reaffirms His promise of years before and assures Sarah that she will bear a son, Isaac. How? For "it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women" she was barren and past age (18:11).
  - BUT GOD! Isaac is born on schedule, (17:19), cf. Rom 4:8-12; Heb. 11:11-12.
     NOTE: God's purpose will not be defeated by a barren womb the seed continues.
- D. Famine and Family (Gen. 41:55-50:26).
  - 1. The seed-people doomed to starvation (42:1-2, cf. 43:8).
  - 2. BUT GOD! "Jehovah was with Joseph".

Read the Biblical account noting God's providence.

NOTE: God's purpose will not be defeated by a barren earth. The seed continues.

- E. Pharaoh and the Enslaved Seed-People (Exod. 1:8ff).
  - 1. The seed-people are doomed by Pharaoh's decrees. The situation is hopeless.
  - BUT GOD! "Moses, Moses" (Exod. 3:4-10, cf. Heb. 11:23-29).
     NOTE: God's purpose will not be defeated by a heathen nation. The ten plagues defeat Satan. The seed continues.
- F. Evil Attempts and David (1 Sam. 16:1-13).
  - 1. By Goliath and Saul (1 Sam. 17:1-51; 18:8-11, 19:1, 8-12).
  - By Absalom (2 Sam. 15).BUT GOD! Seed continues.
- G. Devilish woman and the seed royal (2 Kings 11).
  - 1. Athaliah (Jezebel's daughter) "destroyed al the seed royal".
  - 2. BUT GOD! "took Josash (the heir apparent) and hid him (2 Kings 11:2, cf. 2 Chron. 22:10-12; 23:8-11; 24:1).

NOTE: Again the seed is snatched from the adversary.

- H. Death and Hezekiah (2 Kings 18:1-20:21).
  - 1. Hezekiah is terminally ill with no heir. Satan seemingly will win.
  - 2. BUT GOD! "I will add fifteen years ... " (2 Kings 20:6). NOTE: God's purpose will not be defeated by illness.
- I. Wicked Haman and the Jewish Remnant (Book of Esther).
  - 1. Haman's envy and pride spells destruction for the Jews (3:1-6).
  - 2. King makes a decree to "destroy, to slay, and to cause to perish ALL Jews, both young and old, little children and women ..." (3:13).
  - 3. BUT GOD! "... you are come to the kingdom for just such a time as this ...". NOTE: Esther is the means by which God again preserves the seed-people.
- J. Herod and the Infant Slaughter (Matt. 2)
  - 1. "The Herod ... slew ALL the male children ... from two years old and under ..." (vs. 16).
  - 2. BUT GOD! Joseph is told to carry "the child to Egypt (2:13-15, 19-23). NOTE: God's purpose will not be hindered by lust of pride.

## K. Satan and Jesus

- 1. Devil makes frontal attack through the temptations.
- 2. BUT GOD! "It is written".
  - NOTE: God's purpose will not be hindered by lust of pride.
- L. The Nations and Jesus (John 11:53)
  - 1. The Jewish rejection and the Roman crucifixion combined to make Satan's "Grand Finale" in seeking to trample down the seed.
    - a. The Betrayal (John 13:18, 27)
    - b. The Trial (Matt. 26:59)
    - c. The Cross (Act 2:23)
  - 2. The murder of Jesus (Satan's work, is an evil act used by God in fulfillment of His eternal plan of redemption! (Think about it!) Acts 2:23, 3:14-15, 13:23-29.
  - 3. BUT GOD! Raised up Jesus from the dead declaring Him to be the Son of God. (Rom. 1:4).
    - a. Promised Rom. 1:2.
    - b. Born (seed of David) Rom 1:3.
    - c. Declared Rom. 1:4.

### THE AFTERMATH OF CONFLICT

- A. The Savior's Power is Seen in His Claims
  - 1. Jesus claimed that He was stronger than Satan (Matt. 12:24-30; Luke 11:14-23)
    - a. He spoils his goods (Lit. "to completely plunder"). cf. Mark 3:27.
    - b. He divides his kingdom. cf. John 8:32-33.
    - c. He binds him (Lit. "to put in chains or fetters").
  - 2. Jesus claimed that Satan has no power over Him (John 14:30)
    - a. Jesus, being sinless, negates the Devil's power! (See Heb. 2:9-18; cf. 4:15; 7:25)

    - b. The Cross was not merely the Devil's plot it was God's plan (cf. John 10:17-18)c. Satan was absolutely powerless and fell in total defeat underneath the "heel" of the victorious Christ according to God's promise! (See Revelations 1:17-18).

NOTE: Jesus' life was not taken from Him. He "voluntarily willed" Himself to die. (See John 19:30; cf. 7:30; 8:80; 12:23, 27).

- B. The Savior's Power is Seen in His Cross.
  - 1. The Power of the cross (John 12:31-33; cf. Rom. 1:16-17 with 1 Cor. 1:18-2:2)
  - 2. The Power of the cross confirmed by His own resurrection (John 14:18-20; 16:17-24, 33; cf. Rom. 1:4).
    - a. He burst the gates of the grave! (Matt. 28:1-7)
    - b. Death could not possibly hold him! (Act. 2:23-24; 13:32)
    - c. He wrested Satan's power from Him! (Heb. 2:14-15; 1 John 3:8). Jesus is Conqueror and Victor! (Rev. 1:17-18).

#### THE DOCTINAL SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CONFLICT

- A. The Promise of God can be relied on.
- B. The Providence of God will protect his people.
- C. The Purpose of God will always stand.

NOTE: The Proposed Enmity still continues. (Rom. 16:19b-20).
